

RESIDENTS FORM MORGAN C O R P

The newly formed Morgan Committee of Recreational Planning met last Tuesday, May 31, at the Jesse Selover School in Morgan. 51 interested parents attended.

The intention of this group is to discuss the needs of recreational facilities in Morgan and the Munns Village area and what can be done to obtain them.

The issue of the evening was serious concern for the lack of recreational facilities for all age groups. Recreational facilities have been provided in other sections of the borough. Whereas, Morgan and Munns Village have received very little.

PETITION

TO BE CIRCULATED

As a result, a petition will be circulated among the Morgan and Munns Village residents to stress the need to the Sayreville governing body. This petition will be presented at the next regular council meeting.

John DiPoalo, the chairman of the petition committee, said the major complaint of residents is that \$15,000 has been put aside for recreational purposes two years ago but little has been done to date. Only \$1,900 of this money has been spent in the Morgan -- and that went into grading Bayview Manor Park located off Manor St.

The only recreational facilities now in Morgan on borough property are about a half dozen swings. There is no suitable place to play baseball. There is a Little League baseball field on Board of Education property, but that can only be used by league players.

Over 5 years ago the Borough Council promised the residents of Morgan that they would have a Pop Warner football field, a Babe Ruth baseball field, tennis handball and basketball courts. We are still waiting, DiPoalo said.

Moderator for last Tuesday night's meeting was Phil Arnelia.

The next meeting of the Morgan Committee of Recreational Planning will be held on Tuesday, June 7, 1966 at 8 p.m. at the Jesse Selover School, Morgan.

Memorial Day Services Honor Local War Dead And Deceased Firemen

The pleasant change in the weather brought out a record crowd to view the annual Memorial Day parade. This year's observance was under the direction of the Sacred Heart Post 378, Catholic War Veterans with the American Legion, Luke A. Lovely Post 62, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2448, and the John Connors Post, Disabled War Veterans assisting in the arrangements.

John J. Jankowski, a past commander of the Sacred Heart Post 378 and U. S. Navy Veteran was honored as the parade Grand Marshal. Jankowski served aboard an aircraft carrier as a boatswain's mate.

The parade started at 1:30 p.m. from the Sacred Heart Church parking lot and proceeded down Main St., across Broadway to John St. and ended at the City Hall where Memorial Services were conducted for the local deceased members of the armed forces and the local fire department. Rev. Leon Kasprzyk, assistant pastor of the Sacred Heart Church offered the invocation, while Mrs. Ann Marie Nebus sang the National Anthem. The Imperial Band of South River accompanied Mrs. Nebus. Mrs. J. Fabiszewski and Mrs. V. Gatz placed the wreath on the World War II Monument. John J. Jankowski, the parade grand marshal, recited the prayer for the dead. Councilman John J. Howley, fire commissioner, conducted the Memorial Services at the firemen's memorial for the deceased members of the local fire department.

Edwin Smith, a veteran of the Korean conflict, and a prisoner of war for over two years was the principal speaker. He stressed the importance and appreciation of the "American way of life..." and said that it is tragic that many persons take things for granted and have to lose their freedom in order to appreciate it. Mayor Schultz extended his official welcome to the participants of the parade and thanks for their co-operation. Bernard Soden, general chairman, and his committee were given acknowledgment for their efforts in making the necessary arrangements for the parade and the memorial services conducted at the various cemeteries.

Councilman Frank Zebro of the first ward was the master of ceremonies. He referred to the Gold Star Mothers as a special type of American hero -- who carried the heaviest cross of the war, and who deserve our eternal gratitude.

Adam L. Rzepka, past commander of the Sacred Heart Post 378 conducted the Memorial services at the Veteran's Monument on Broadway.

Father George Brembo, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church closed the services with benediction.

The units in line of march included: the mayor and members of the city council; the police department; local fire departments and their auxiliaries; the local First Aid & Safety Squad, Girl Scout and Boy Scout units; members of the Catholic War Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, and Disabled American Vets.

Other units in the line of march were: St. Mary's High School Drum & Bugle Corps; The Colleen; Melrose Color Guard; Imperial Band of South River; the Black Hawk Junior Drum & Bugle Corps of East Brunswick.

Preceding the parade a Memorial Day Field Mass was held at the Sacred Heart Cemetery. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Walter Urbanik was celebrant of the Mass, and the Rev. Myron Gayda was assistant.

Following the Mass, Memorial Services were held at the Veterans' Plot by Msgr. Urbanik and the Catholic War Veterans Post 378. Adam Rzepka recited the veterans' prayer, "Our Dead".

Charles Sharo and Edmund Kaboski were color bearers. Post Commander Bernard Soden and Auxiliary President Mrs. Elizabeth Marczak headed their groups at the services.

Letters To The Editor

To the editor:

In response to the letter written by Mr. Anthony J. Ruszala in your May 19, 1966 issue of the So. Amboy Citizen, I find this letter purely prejudice and without facts.

The statement that I opposed apartments in my campaign is false. I stated in 1963 and I reiterate now, I oppose individual home sites on the landfill. Never was apartments mentioned.

As for Mr. A. J. Ruszala not having the opportunity to object to this application is again a false statement. Mr. A. J. Ruszala occupied nearly half of the hearings on this application heard by the Board of Adjustment. The writer of the letter surely forgot who agreed with the differences in the surveys, didn't I personally present the third difference, with respect to the city tax map. Wasn't I and the Board of Adjustment so concerned over this point, that a personal check with the county tax map was introduced by the Board of Adjustment. During this same line of questioning wasn't the applicants ownership of this property challenged, didn't the Board of Adjustment again investigate this charge, and what did the county tax map show? Didn't the applicant present a deed of ownership dated August 31, 1964, and didn't the Board have the proof as recorded in the County Clerk's Office, what was the reply that the records were changed between Feb. and April of this year.

The statement that the entire community was opposed to this apartment, the only objectors present at the three hearings on this application were Mr. & Mrs. Anthony J. Ruszala. As for the petition was it for this variance, or was it for some other? Didn't the attorney for the applicant challenge this petition as being over a year old, and that several names on this paper were now deceased.

I'm quite sure Mr. A. J. Ruszala realizes that the applicant could "without seeking a variance" build a store or stores with apartments over these stores and that these stores could extend out to the sidewalk. The property in question is located in a business zoned district.

Wasn't the writer, the same Mr. A. J. Ruszala who appeared before the Board of Adjustment several years ago seeking the same type of variance, to build on an undersized lot. Is there some other reason for the objection?

In closing, I would like to explain that the local Board of Adjustment "only recommends" granting a variance, "It does not grant a variance". This is the responsibility of the Board of Public Works.

TIPS ON SAFE DRIVING

Dan, Zack, the President of Briggs Chevrolet, announced today that in a recent bulletin released by General Motors, certain suggestions were made by their Proving Ground experts on safe and sane vacation driving.

First, try to plan your trip over freeways. Statistical surveys show that the freeways have far better safety records. In other words, roads that are engineered to be safer, really are. And they're more convenient too.

(Watch those rush hours). Another tip in planning your route is to try to avoid arriving in metropolitan areas when commuter traffic is heavy. Get acquainted with the speed limits and signs as soon as you can when traveling into another state.

Next, it's wise to have your car checked by a professional before you set out.

Now, most important, the driver. Make sure to get plenty of rest. If you're leaving early, get to bed early. And it's a good idea to eat sparingly before taking the wheel... it's no place to be drowsy.

(Stay alert). To stay alert, you can supply a number of suggestions that our drivers have found useful. Stop at least once every two hours - preferably more often - and take a brief walk to loosen tense muscles. Coffee, fruit juice or pop will refresh you too. And while you drive, keep a continuous supply of fresh air going through the car.

Another good way to stay alert is by keeping the radio on and switching stations frequently. Changing seat positions can keep you feeling fresh too.

(Use those seat belts). The minute you're in the car, the first thing to do is buckle up. Next adjust your mirrors. And, as you drive, include them in the regular sweep of your eyes. If you decide to drive after dark, switch drivers, if you can, or, at the very least, take a "breather" before going on. Keep your guard up and your speed down. (A word about speed). Whatever the posted limit, underlying it is the basic rule that speed should never be greater than what is "reasonable and prudent".

Some tire tips:

1. Tires should always be inflated cold, before starting a trip. Pressures recommended in the owner's manual should always be used.

2. Tires should not be deflated when their pressure builds up during a trip. It is natural for pressure to increase when a tire becomes warm from the speeds and loads of a highway trip. The increase in pressure is the tire's way of protecting itself.

3. Wheels and tires should be balanced together, and the spare should also be balanced.

4. Frequent inspection of tires for uneven tread wear, imbedded objects, cuts, bruises, and inflation pressure is free safety insurance.

TROOPER YOUTH WEEK SET

The second annual Trooper Youth Week will be held at the New Jersey Police Academy, Sea Girt, June 12 through June 28, according to an announcement made today by Colonel D. B. Kelly, State Police Superintendent.

Fifty eleventh-grade boys from public and parochial schools throughout the State were selected by school authorities on the basis of character, scholarship and physical ability. Those selected to participate in the program will attend a full week of simulated police training at the academy.

The fast-moving program of lectures, films, demonstrations and practical exercises parallels the academic and physical training required in the preparation for a law enforcement career. High spot of the week will be a field trip to Division Headquarters in West Trenton. There, the boys will see a State Police class in training and tour the headquarters' sections and the State Bureau of Identification. This unique educational experience is designed to provide a better understanding of the functions of law enforcement in our free society.

Dr. William H. Warner, Director of Secondary Education for the New Jersey Department of Education will be principal speaker at formal graduation exercises to be held at the academy on Saturday, June 18, at 1:00 p.m. The ceremony will include recognition of State Police personnel who have distinguished themselves in the line of duty during the year.

Each boy will be expected upon his return to school, to report on his experiences to the student body. The report, made during his senior year, may take shape as an assembly program, a feature story in his school newspaper, an exhibit, or any other form he deems appropriate. He may enlist the aid of one member of the Division of State Police for whatever practical assistance may be required in his project.

Commenting on the program, Colonel Kelly said, "I am extremely pleased with the success of last year's pilot program and the enthusiastic response to this year's Trooper Youth Week. There is no question that the boys benefit by their experience and, equally important, are able to convey something of value to their fellow students as they prepare to assume the responsibility of adult citizenship."
